




Radiology


A dental x-ray machine is an invaluable tool in veterinary dentistry. Without it, numerous problems below the gum line would go undiagnosed. Dental radiographs are also



beneficial for pre-purchase exams on young animals to be sure they have all of their adult teeth. Dental radiographs should be performed periodically on all animals regardless of their periodontal health.

Endodontics

Endodontics is a branch of dentistry that deals with diseases of the pulp. Often the pulp will become damaged or destroyed by chewing on bones or other hard



objects. When the pulp becomes exposed, treatment is required. This painful problem cannot be ignored. If ignored, the tooth can become abscessed, affect other teeth, lead to tooth loss, or cause systemic complications.

Oral Surgery

Oral surgery is frequently required in animals with oral tumors, oronasal fistula repair, periodontal disease, and fracture repair. Veterinary Dental Center of Tulsa has the ability to treat most conditions requiring surgery.



Pediatric Dentistry

A variety of dental problems occur in pediatric patients. Treating these conditions early will often prevent additional, more severe,



problems from developing.

Orthodontics

The goal of orthodontics in pets is not to conceal genetic



defects, but to give the pet a comfortable bite. Malocclusions are very common and need to be addressed when the pet is very young.

Restorative Dentistry

Damaged teeth can result from a variety of conditions. Often it is desirable to restore the tooth for protection, improved function, or aesthetic reasons. Any condition which



results in the loss of enamel or dentin weakens the tooth, increases sensitivity, and can allow bacteria to migrate to the pulp.
